She cast a glance around the room. Her brother Charlie was on the videophone, talking and laughing with his best friend Hui. Hui lived in China and they had never met in the flesh, but they were in the same class at the Cyberspace School and talked every day. Hui had once asked Charlie to pay him a visit, but Charlie said there was no point since he had seen a programme about China on the 3-D TV set and knew what it was like.

In the study, through its soundproof glass wall, Trudy could see her mother and father at work. Her mother worked for an on-line publishing company, writing books that taught English to children from other countries. She was in a meeting - on the computer screen, in front of her, she could see all her colleagues. They were saying that she

used very difficult words in the books she wrote, and that the students would have trouble with them. She was arguing that it was important to stretch them a bit, rather than hand them everything on a plate. Trudy couldn't hear any of this. All she could see was her mother waving her arms around a lot, and it looked so funny that Trudy started laughing.

Her father was a surgeon, but he didn't have to go into the hospital. Somewhere in Australia, a patient lay in a silent operating theatre, and robot arms moved in obedience to her father's hand movements, carrying out the delicate operation. This way, he could do double the amount of operations than he would do if he had to go to the hospital in person. Trudy found it strange that her father, sitting there calmly and quietly, was actually busy saving someone's life.

She turned back to her brother, but he had now put on his own virtual reality headset and was (Trudy guessed from what he had said at breakfast) deep in space in search of new planets to colonise. He would be there until dinner now. Trudy knew from experience that if she disturbed him, he would be furious. Charlie took the games he played very seriously; so seriously, in fact, that Trudy was sometimes unsure that he actually realised they were games at all.

Her little robot dog, Biggles, came up to her, its tail wagging. It wanted to be stroked, but Trudy wasn't allowed. It had chewed up her mother's satellite phone the day before, and when your robot pet did something wrong, you had to punish it strictly, or it would just carry on doing it. She went to the window and looked down at the street below. It was cloudy and had got dark early; no one was out there, but every window glowed brightly, or flickered with the blue light of a television screen.
