She suggested people swap watching TV for reading to live longer. She said:
"Individuals over the age of 65 spend an average of 4.4 hours per day watching
television. 10 to redirect leisure time into reading books could
prove to be beneficial."

GETTING AWAY FROM IT ALL

The wonderful thing about a holiday is that it refreshes you because it gives you a chance to get away from your normal routine and have a break. You put your problems aside and just concentrate on enjoying yourself.

There are lots of different types of holiday available. There are package holidays, for example, where a travel agent arranges everything, including both flights and accommodation, and then there are trips you can organise yourself. There are guided tours where you travel by coach and a guide gives you information about places of interest such as archaeological sites, castles and historical monuments. There are also holidays for the more adventurous, such as safaris. If you go on a safari, you may camp in the open.
