After seeing more boats I made arrangements to travel all the way in a boat called the Kaseli. Built in 1942, the Kaseli was made of wood with multicoloured paintwork; it had a funnel and small decks, well scrubbed and clean. Its cargo for the first stage of the journey was a piano.

The voyage began on time and the Kaseli sailed north -west along the coast. The mouth of the river Sepik is marked by a muddy stain, miles wide, where its waters meet the blue ocean. The Sepik's annual water-flow makes it one of the world's largest rivers; parts of the river are well-known to tourists, while some people use it instead of a road.

The Kaseli first stopped overnight to deliver the piano and to collect some oil-drums. Early in the morning while waiting for the boat to depart, I made a quick trip to the market-place to get some supplies of sugar-cane and smoked fish. A woman selling smoked fish looked at me in amazement and I was delighted to see someone who recognised me and called me by name. Her mother, had also come downriver to market. Both women grasped my hands, telling me news of their village, and they gave me several smoked fish wrapped in banana leaves.

After leaving, the river was peaceful, the only traffic some motor-canoes laden with cargo and passengers who held brightly - coloured umbrellas to give shade from the hot sun.

Along the river - banks I noticed some bush fires. As we went past the fires their ash rained down in the air, and as the smoke rose above us it covered the sun, giving the sky an odd, pink colour. The Kaseli's captain, a large man with a weather-beaten face, told me that the lighting of these fires is usually done on purpose. It was now the dry season and the river-level was low enough for the villagers to clear fertile, riverside plots and cultivate some vegetables before the yearly flood-waters returned.

Lying in a broad valley, the river curves through the forest in huge, sweeping bends like a giant, flat snake. I leaned against the front of the boat feeling contented.
