After leaving，the river was peaceful，the only traffic some motor－canoes laden with cargo and passengers who held brightly－coloured umbrellas to give shade from the hot sun．

Along the river - banks I noticed some bush fires. As we went past the fires their ash rained down in the air, and as the smoke rose above us it covered the sun, giving the sky an odd, pink colour. The Kaseli's captain, a large man with a weather-beaten face, told me that the lighting of these fires is usually done on puppose. It was now the dry season and the river-level was low enough for the villagers to clear fertile, riverside plots and cultivate some vegetables before the yearly flood-waters returned.
