PART 1: READING COMPREHENSION

(50 MARKS)

Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow:

Ice age **residents** spent much of the year in comfortable camps **complete** with hearths and cobblestone floors. They also built summer houses with a good view; seventy-five percent of these summer houses faced south, which shows that they took advantage of solar heat.

By 17,000 years ago, Ice Age hunters had invented the spear, which helped them to throw weapons faster and more accurately. Meat was preserved in cold caves and could be **consumed** months later. Their diet was very healthy, which probably explains why they lived longer. Although scientists have found that Ice people suffered from arthritis, teeth from that period show that they didn't have cavities

The graves that archaeologists have found show that Ice people believed in life after death. In a 20,000-year-old grave near Moscow, a man was buried with 2,000 ivory beads; two boys were buried with 8,000 ivory beads and a lot of rings. These goods were probably things that the dead were thought to need in their new life.

Research has found few **indications** that the clans of the Ice Age fought each other. Violent **conflicts** came when man built agricultural settlements 8,000 years ago and had to defend his land. It is from Ice Age people that we have inherited the best in us: language, art and a sense of community.

In 1925, archaeologists found a spear which was 10,500 years old. This spear was the first evidence of Ice Age humans ever found in the Americas.

Scientists have debated for decades about when Ice Age people came to the Americas. Some scientists say that it was 15,000 years ago; others say that they came to North America 100,000 years ago and took thousands of years to reach South America . This latter theory received support from researchers who found cave paintings in Brazil which were 32,000 years old. Since then, objects belonging to Ice Age people have been found in Canada and Central America.

It is, of course, a mystery that most of these objects have been found in South America. In Peru, MacNeish found a cave that is 25,000 years old, and in Chile, Tom Dillehary found 13,000-year-old

huts. Some scientists believe that the geology of South America has preserved ancient objects better than in North America. The question, however, of whether Ice Age people first sailed across the Pacific to South America remains unanswered.
